- 1) I applaud the proposed changes to clause 5.22, which are in accordance with the legislation, Model Code and current practice.
- 2) I think the drafting could be improved if the first sentence were re-worded to read as follows: "A recording of each meeting of the council and committee of the council is to be retained on the council's website **for** a minimum of four years **from the date of that meeting**". (New wording in bold).
- 3) I also approve the new clause 8.1, as I assume it is in accordance with the current meeting practice followed by the council.
- 4) Although clause 11.2 (casting vote) is not proposed to be changed and is not covered by the public consultation, nonetheless I express the concern of myself and a number of my colleagues to the number of times the casting vote is used by the Mayor at meetings of the Council. Traditional common law would require a casting vote to be used sparingly and usually in support of the status quo. Unfortunately neither the legislation nor the Model Code qualifies the manner in which the casting vote can and should be used. Perhaps this should be a matter for further investigation and public comment.
