MAYOR'S MESSAGE

The Council is committed to upgrading and revitalising Ku-ring-gai's major centres such as Turramurra and Lindfield and much of this year will be devoted to progressing these projects.

However we are also committed to revitalising smaller centres. One of these is East Lindfield, with the facelift of the local shopping area in Wellington Road completed this month.

After talking to residents and business owners last year to get an idea of what improvements they felt were needed, the centre now has new footpaths and a sandstone paved entrance to improve connections between parking areas, the shops and surrounding streets. New shade trees and shrubs have been planted, and new seating and bins installed.

We look forward to bringing further improvements to other local shopping centres in the coming months.

One of Shakespeare's most delightful plays Twelfth Night will be performed at the Ku-ring-gai Wildflower Garden on Sunday 4 March starting at 5pm. This special one-off twilight performance will be a chance to enjoy live theatre in a unique
