The area proposed is already an off leash area and it is hardly used because it is dark, dirty and poorly/not maintained. It is a great idea to "formalise" the existing offleash area if it leads to the area actually being fenced (including the west side - the foul and filthy ditch of water does not constitute an appropriate or safe boundary), upgraded and properly maintained (especially the tress and their debris) so that it is suitable for public use (there is currently a significant build up of leaf and other debris from the trees and often rotting animal corpses and a lot of dog poo which presumably is because it is very hard for owners to locate and retrieve it from the extensive uncleared leaf litter). | 2019/05/08 14:20:21 |
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|  |  | However, I strongly suggest that you make it off-leash ONLY after 1 pm . Claude Cameron Reserve is basically full of dog poos and large holes, but at least you can spot and avoid them because the floor is grass. A significant contributing factor is SOME professional dog walkers mainly operating in the morning who bring large numbers of animals and do not supervise them or their digging or toileting properly, unlike Golden Jubilee which is not used by professional walkers because it's only off leash after 1 pm , which is clean and unspoilt. The "proposed" space at Karuah is small and will be difficult to keep hole free and clean anyway because of the leaves and brown poocamouflage floor, and it simply will not support the volumes of professional dog walkers and behaviour I have seen regularly at Claude Cameron - it will be full of camouflaged holes and poo for people to trip in and step in. Limiting off-leash to after 1 pm will exclude many professional dog walkers, and MOST actual dog owners can and do keep a better watch of their one or two pets and can maintain and enjoy a safe and clean facility. |  |
