Attachment A1 – Council Decisions relating to the Lindfield Library Site at 259-271 Pacific Highway, Lindfield

At the Ordinary Meeting of Council on 8 May 2018, there were representations that the Old Lindfield Library located at 259-271 Pacific Highway Lindfield was not for sale.

Despite these representations, the public record suggests that the sale of the Old Lindfield Library may have been planned for at least three years. The below timeline presents key council decisions which indicate this.
